Annual Heroes for the Home Breakfast event raises \$241,145 Creator of Toyland Christmas and Local Veterinarian Honored as 2018 Heroes for the Home

Louisville, Ky. (June 7, 2018) – Mr. Louis and Mrs. Donna Kinnaird and Dr. Thomas and Mrs. Jonda Wiggins were named the 2018 Heroes for the Home during the Home's annual fundraiser on Thursday, June 7 at Omni Hotel. The event raised a record-setting \$241,145 for the organization.

The Kinnairds and Wiggins were honored for their decades-long dedication to supporting Home of the Innocents, contributing financially and non-monetarily to impact the lives of children and families served by the organization.

For nearly three decades, the Wiggins have hosted an annual Christmas party and various events throughout the year for residents. "We want to ensure that these children have experiences that any other child would have," shared Jonda.

The Kinnairds have decorated their home in Okolona to host Toyland Christmas for 13 years. Their light display has turned into a fundraiser for the Home, raising more than \$167,000 to date. "The kids at the Home don't deserve anything that's been done to them, so I want to do what I can to help. That's why we give to Home of the Innocents," explained Louis.

The Hero for the Home Award is presented to members of our community who has given long-lasting support to the Home's children. The awards were presented to the Wiggins and Kinnairds in front of a crowd of more than 1,000 guests who enjoyed breakfast while hearing how Home of the Innocents enriches the lives of children and families with hope, health, and happiness.
